In the article by Wardlaw et al, “What are White Matter Hyperintensities Made of? Relevance to Vascular Cognitive Impairment,” which published online June 23, 2015, and appeared in the June 2015 issue of the journal (*J Am Heart Assoc.* 2015;4:e001140 doi: 10.1161/JAHA.114.001140), several corrections were needed.
